Record Cold July

Fort Wayne set an all time record low average temperature for the month of July in 2009. The average monthly temperature was 68.9 degrees, 4.5 degrees below normal. The previous record was 69.7 degrees set in 1967. The average high temperature in July 2009 was 79.2 degrees which is the record coolest average high temperature for July last set in 1915.

New Forms May be Required by FSA

The Farms Services Agency has sent out mailings to many farmers and landlords about signing forms 926, 927, and 928. Some of you have called me inquiring about your responsibilities concerning these forms. I contacted the FSA office about this and was told that if your land is cash rented, there is nothing you need to do. For those who are on a share crop agreement, there is some required paperwork. I can take care of what needs to be done for you. I do encourage each of you to make a call to the FSA office to clarify your personal situation, just to be sure.
